"All the same, the rejection of distortions of sexuality and eroticism should never lead us to a disparagement or neglect of sexuality and eros in themselves. For this reason, "man cannot live by oblative, descending love alone. He cannot al-ways give, he must also receive. Anyone who wishes to give love must also receive love as a gift". Still, we must never forget that our human equilibrium is fragile; there is a part of us that resists real human growth, and any moment it can unleash the most Pope Francis, Ch.4#157, Amoris Laetitia) primitive and selfish tendencies.

TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS

On Friday of this week the Church celebrated the Triumph or Exaltation of the Cross. Many of us Catholics would probably make a claim that we would believe more deeply if we could but encounter the earthly Jesus now - I wonder where might we place ourselves in the events of Good Friday?

Would we be like the Roman soldier, trying to get another day's work? Would we be like the country-bred Simon, drafted, because of his obvious physical strength, to help Jesus carry the Cross? Or like the women of Jerusalem, unable to prevent the machinery of the Roman government from killing Jesus? Or like the Pharisees and Sadducees, trying to look righteous but hearts full of revenge and hate? Or like most of the onlookers, curious certainly and yet unwilling to take a stand either for or against Jesus? Or like Veronica who wiped Jesus' face?

Where would we have stood on that Good Friday so long ago?

Today we asked to be honest about the Cross' symbolism just as much as responding to Jesus' question in today's Gospel, "Who do people say I am?", Mark 8:27. It may be a strange time of the year, after all, Easter is long gone and Advent isn't even really close.

Yet the Church puts this Feast of the Triumph of the Cross and to ponder on Jesus' true nature right here in Springtime --- to remind us that we can never really go around it or even go out of it safely aside. The church herself calls each of us to ask ourselves this question: How are we now, today, called to live with and respond to who is Jesus for me and the tragedy and triumph of the Jesus' cross?

Jesus, in the faces of suffering people the world over, still hangs from the cross today? If we choose not either to see or respond to his suffering in them, then there is not Triumph of the Cross today, despite the church's proclamation. If we do, then everyday is a feast day too, our triumph on the cross along with Jesus' triumph. Jesus is looking into the eyes of each of us today with his own - dare we say no?

WELCOME Fr Nick De Groot SVD

Fr Nick will arrive on 4 October 2018 and will stay in the parish until 11 Feb 2019 whilst Fr Raass is away on the parish pilgrimage and home leave. Fr Nick will

assist Frs Alex, Olivier and the Parish Council in the overall leadership and direction of OLSH Parish.

Fr Nick was the Director of Janssen Spiritualty Centre in Melbourne. He was born in The Hague in The Netherlands in 1943. His family migrated to Australia in 1953. He studied philosophy and theology in Chicago and returned to Australia in 1969 for his ordination in Brisbane. He then returned to Europe and graduated with a Licentiate degree in Moral Theology from the Alfonsianum University in Rome in 1972. His first assignment was to teach theology at the Major Seminary in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea. In 1987 he went to Tagaytay in the Philippines to teach Moral Theology in the major seminary. In 1990, Fr Nick was asked if he would be willing to return to Papua New Guinea to join the Melanesian Institute. (The Melanesian Institute (MI) was established in 1970 to do research and promotion of the traditional cultures of PNG. The MI is an ecumenical Institution with the staff coming from the Anglican, Lutheran, United and Catholic Church. He was the Director of the Institute for 12 years. As for many other priests everywhere, one hardly ever wears only one hat. During his time at the MI, he was chosen to be the Director of the PNG Pontifical Mission Societies for 6 years and Chairman of the Board of Word Publishing Company for 10 years. Fortunately for him, not all these appointments were simultaneous. In 2006, after 16 years at the Melanesian Institute, Fr Nick became the General Secretary for the Catholic Bishops Conference in PNG. Welcome.

Final Royal Commission Recommendation to the Catholic Church

Recommendation 16.26

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference should consult with the Holy See, and make public any advice received, in order to clarify whether:

a. information received from a child during the sacrament of reconciliation that they have been sexually abused is covered by the seal of confession

b. if a person confesses during the sacrament of reconciliation to perpetrating child sexual abuse, absolution can and should be withheld until they report themselves to civil authorities.

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9

I gave my body to those who struck me.

The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed. My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me. The Lord is coming to my help, who dare condemn me? Second Reading: St James 2:14-18

Faith without good works is dead.

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead. This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and 1 have good deeds; 1 will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds - now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

You are the Christ ... The Son of Man was destined to suffer much.

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him. And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.
