### "Let Us Make Three Tents - right here!"

In this Gospel today I'm drawn to Peter and his clumsy response. He sounds so like me! "Let's freeze this moment, let's build a monument and stay here on this mountain." Here he has had a profound spiritual experience, and he immediately seems to generalize that God's presence must be tied to or confined to this particular mountaintop location, this particular spot.

Peter wants to externalize an experience which is basically internal, a matter of the heart. The OT people speak of the mountain as the place where God dwells—the cloud on the mountain. Some have called the Bunya Mountains of Queensland "God's country." Of course, we might drive to some mountains elsewhere for a fresh panoramic perspective. We might think that God is "over there"!

For many years Thomas Merton, the famous Trappist monk and mystic lived as a hermit, a life of solitude in the woods of Gethsemani, Kentucky. Merton died in 1968, but people continue to marvel at his simple dwelling in the woods. Another contemporary mystic namely, Richard Rohr took a sabbatical a few years ago and asked to stay in Thomas Merton's hermitage because he wanted to catch some of Merton's prayerful spirit.

While Richard was there one of the Trappist monks recognized him. Rohr saw him at a distance, but tried to be respectful and not disturb his solitude. He then surprised Richard by breaking his silence and shouting to him, "Richard, you get to preach and I don't. When you're out there preaching, please tell the people one thing. **God is not 'out there.'** God bless you." (See Richard Rohr, p. 101, Everything Belongs: The Gift of Contemplative Prayer)

Rohr then wrote a whole book on contemplative prayer to tell us that God is not OUT THERE or UP THERE—not in some place or moment or booth on a mountain top. **God is within us and within the creation** (Luke 17:21). As Rohr says, we would make giant steps if we could see that God is dwelling all around us and within each of us. Then we would have much greater difficulty destroying the earth or destroying people in whom God dwells.

Our job then is not to go to some mountaintop to be "spiritual," but to come to awareness of what already is—in the present moment and present time, exactly where we are in the here-and-now. Our search for God is like holding a lantern, looking for a light. We are searching for what we already have.

Make time this Season of Lent to be conscious of moments when God will show up — on the trail, in the kitchen, in the silence, in the glint of sunlight dancing on the waters, in the birth of a baby or in the suffering of neighbor. Our job is to wake up to these moments and rejoice like Peter. **Be present. Be attentive. Be responsible. Be grateful.** +

#### Sacrament of Penance: 2<sup>nd</sup> Rite of Reconciliation

The second form of the sacrament of penance is a communal liturgical celebration from beginning to end. It begins with the community listening to the word of God. The homily emphasizes our need for repentance and the infinite mercy of God. During the examination of conscience, the assembly reflects together on where and how they have fallen short of their baptismal commitment to follow Christ. The individual confession and absolution that follows is communal too in that the penitents approach the confessors in full view of all present. It is a moving experience to witness fellow Catholics humbling themselves by publicly approaching a confessor for forgiveness. As they do, we pray for them, that they will know the fullness of God's grace and mercy. After the confessions, the ceremony concludes with a proclamation of praise, a prayer of thanksgiving and a blessing. OLSH Parish will celebrate two Penitential Services (2<sup>nd</sup> Rite of Reconciliation) on **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March** (3<sup>rd</sup> Week of Lent) and Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March (Holy Week) at 6:30pm. The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith.

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.' When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood. Then he stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt-offering in place of his son. The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self - it is the Lord who speaks - because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of their enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10

This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him.

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi', he said it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
