ST PAUL'S PILGRIMAGE Part 1

Many parishioners have asked me to write about my experience of the recent pilgrimage following in the footsteps of St Paul in Turkey and Greece. So, for four weeks in a row I will be sharing this wonderful experience with you. I will also be using scripture texts to support my knowledge and experience. May I encourage you to open your bible and explore the world of Asia Minor with the greatest Apostle to the Gentiles.

Paul as we all know is the most prominent personality of the New Testament, apart from Jesus himself. Fourteen of the twenty-seven books of the New Testament bear his name. All of them are letters. Today much of what we know about Paul comes from these written sources as well as stories from the Acts of the Apostles (chapters 9-28).

Paul, also known by his Jewish name Saul (Acts 13:9) was born in Tarsus, Cicilia, in Asia Minor (now modern Turkey) probably between AD 1 and 10 (Acts :11; 22:3). He was a diaspora Jew, that is, a Jew living outside the homeland of Palestine. Tarsus, being a Roman city, made Paul a Roman citizen and travelled constantly from Turkey to Jerusalem to be schooled by a great rabbi Gamaliel (Acts 22:3). Paul himself admits that he persecuted the followers of Christ out of zeal for his Jewish background (Philippians 3:6; cf.Acts 9:1). He had a remarkable experience on the road to Damascus in which the risen Lord Jesus appeared to him and called him "apostle to the Gentiles" (Acts 9:1-19; cf Romans 11:13). He never describes it in detail but speaks of it as a "revelation of Jesus Christ" (Galatians 1:12). For us readers, we might regard it as a mystical experience of something out of the ordinary. I don't think Paul would call it "conversion". It was an experience which became a point of "commissioning" for him to go to the world of the Gentiles (ancient Greek and Turkey and finally to Rome). After his call or commissioning, Paul began an intense ministry of evangelization outside of Jerusalem.

The CEO pilgrims entered into the world of the New Testament in ancient and Christian Athens where St Paul and his companions established the first Christian communities throughout his four missionary journeys as portrayed in the Acts of the Apostles. In Acts 17:16-21, it says that Paul first came to Athens because it was predominantly a city which worshipped pagan gods with so much history of Persian, Roman, Turkish, philosophical and naval influence. And there we were, standing infront of many temples, sanctuaries as well as the massive Acropolis adorned with statues of gods and heroes. The sight of everything in ancient Athens impressed all of us but must have upset Paul very much (Acts 17:15-34).....to be continued. Fr Raass SVD

Canonisation of Blessed Mother Teresa

Making official what was set in motion back in December, Pope Francis has approved the canonization of five new saints, including Mother Teresa. Hundreds of Mother Tere-

sa's followers are expected to visit Rome when she's canonized on **Sept. 4.** OLSH Parish in consultation with the Missionaries of Charity will celebrate it on the same day at the 9:30am Mass and followed by a parish lunch & social. In addition to Mother Teresa, who was famously a tireless advocate for the poor, Francis approved final canonization plans for four other saints.

Stanislaus of Jesus and Mary (né Jan Papczynski; 1631-1701) of Poland — "a member of the Piarist Order.

Maria Elizabeth Hesselblad (1870-1957) of Sweden — "a convert from Lutheranism, founded a new branch of Bridgettine sisters, dedicated to working and praying for the unity of Scandinavian Christians with the Church. She will be the first Swedish saint in more than 600 years." (June 5)

José Gabriel del Rosario (1840–1914) — "from Pope Francis' native Argentina, known as the 'gaucho priest.' Like the famous Argentinian cattlemen, he traveled on a mule throughout the vast territory of his parish in order to be close to the members of his flock." (Oct. 16)

José Luis Sánchez del Río (1913–1928) of Mexico — "Blessed José was just fourteen-years-old when he was martyred by the Mexican government during the Cristeros War, after refusing to deny his Faith." (Oct. 16)
