Rejoice And Be Glad, Your Reward Will Be Great In Heaven

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints. It is a lovely feast to remember all those lovely people who have been our role models in our life and have inspired us to live a saintly life. This feast is very significant because it helps us to remember all those people who are canonised by the Catholic Church and most importantly those people who are saints through their virtuous life and not yet officially declared saints. Therefore the saints in this list are numerous as the first reading tells us today, "After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language....They have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb." These are the people with whom we have shared our lives, our parents, our grandparents, uncles, aunts, brothers and sisters, neighbours, friends, relatives who have passed on and have left a wonderful example for us to live a worthy life.

The Gospel today highlights the beatitudes and invites us to look into our lives and see if we have been able to live a life worthy of them. The beatitudes are the fulfilment of the Ten Commandments as Jesus did it in his own life. He is inviting us to do the same today in our lives. We can always be lawful by not breaking the Ten Commandments, but can we work to fulfil the Ten Commandments? Yes, we can and Jesus has shown us the way in today's Gospel. We are invited to be poor in spirit, merciful, gentle, pure in heart, peacemakers, persecuted for the Word. We are challenged to be counter example to the messages of the modern world. We are asked to stand tall in witnessing to the life of Christ and live it ourselves because "of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are." Once we accept and acknowledge that we are the children of God, all things begin to fall in place. We work for the reign of God, we become faithful in our ministry, and above all, we accept everyone as our brothers and sisters. And I feel that is what the saints did, that is what many of the people, who have now passed on, have done and have left us the legacy to build our lives on. Therefore, as we are celebrating this wonderful feast, let us pray that may we be guided by God's Spirit in our daily venture in realising God's reign among us and follow the beatitudes to fulfil the Ten Commandments and we will Rejoice and be glad for our reward will be great in Heaven. Amen.

Update on Synod on the Family (4th October – 25th October, Vatican)

The Synod on the Family is concluded on the 24th of October. Pope Francis will write an Apostolic Exhortation following the Synod. The papal document “will be based on the conclusions of the synod, as is the tradition,” says Cardinal Secretary of State, Pietro Parolin. He also said that the synod fathers, in their final document, which they approved on October 24, had requested Pope Francis write a document on the family.

“We humbly ask the Holy Father that he evaluate the opportunity of offering a document on the family,” the request said. “So that in it the domestic church may reflect always more clearly Christ, the light of the world.”

Asked when the document might appear, Cardinal Parolin added: “This I don’t know, but I don’t think it will take too long. After all, it’s best to strike while the iron’s hot.”

Did you know?

- This well-known and much loved text is known as The Beatitudes (blessings).
- There is a parallel text in Luke's Gospel (Lk 6:20) that has slight differences to Matthew's version (used here) and includes a number of curses, as well as the blessings.
- Matthew's Beatitudes are delivered on a hill (Luke's are given on a plain) because Matthew presents Jesus as the new Moses. Moses received the Law from God on the mountain and Jesus gives the 'new law' also on a mountain.
- Matthew is writing for a Jewish Christian audience so he often presents Jesus as the fulfilment of the Old Law.

Solemnity of All Saints
31st October - 1st November 2015

Entrance Antiphon:

Let us all rejoice in the Lord, as we celebrate the feast day in honour of all the Saints, at whose festival the Angels rejoice and praise the Son of God.

First Reading:

Apoc 7:2-4,9-14

I saw an immense crowd, beyond hope of counting, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language.

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea. 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel. After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words: 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.' One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him. 'You can tell me, my Lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.'

We shall see God as he really is.
